

Terminology Word Wall

Baltimore City School System is in a state of transition and you will hear many new words and may be unsure of some terminology. Here are a few words and acronyms with their explanations to help you over the next year.

CCSS: Common Core State Standards

CVC Word: Consonant, Vowel, Consonant Word (ex. dog)

CVCC Word: Consonant, Vowel, Consonant, Consonant Word (ex. post)

Fluency: Speed and accuracy when reading text

Comprehension: Understanding of what is being read; Being able to answer questions about a text.

Number Bond: A mental picture of the relationship between a number and the parts that combine to make it.

Graphic Organizer: A visual or pictorial representation that is used to organize thoughts and information.

Independent vs. Instructional Level: Independent level is a child's ability to successfully work without teacher assistance. Instructional level is where the child is working with teacher assistance.

Amplify: The new assessment name for what was previously known as Wireless.




Box Tops for Education


PTA Highlight!
